## MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT & CEO

**Dear Family and Friends of Our House,**

Another year has flown by, but I need to take a moment to stop and say that we here at Our House, Inc. are so appreciative of your unwavering support year after year! Thanks to your generosity and our collective efforts, we served 300 adults in our programs and we are incredibly grateful for the difference we can make in their lives because of your help. Thank You!

This past year, we have worked to empower our individuals by strengthening the services that we offer. You can learn more about those ways on pages 12-13, but here is one I'd like to highlight. We invested in adding a Recreation Coordinator to our Residential and Day Services departments, as we believe that meaningful days, evenings and weekends offer valuable opportunities for bonding with others, exploring personal interests and relaxing with their peers. These benefits all lead to improved mental and physical well-being.

Studies have shown that adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) have much higher rates of mental illness. However, in most instances, they do not receive the support they need due to the complexity of their I/DD diagnoses and because many mental health providers are not adequately trained to treat them. As a result, in addition to focusing on the benefits recreation has on mental health, Our House is developing a comprehensive plan to expand the mental health services we offer to the people we serve as well as for our direct support staff.

▲ *On Leap Day, we spent an enchanting evening at our 31<sup>st</sup> Annual Achievement Awards empowering those we serve by celebrating the accomplishments of our residents, participants and supported employees while being surrounded by their loved ones, dedicated staff, award recipients and members of our Board of Trustees. Following the event, I toured our day program sites so our participants could each have their own moment to revel in their personal growth.*

At the end of FY24, we reached the \$8.907 million-dollar mark of our *We Create the Future Capital/Endowment Campaign* — we are so close to reaching our \$10 million goal! Please turn to page 10 to learn more about our comprehensive campaign and how you can help us reach our goal.

## OUR HOUSE FOUNDATION: HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

Did you know that in 2010 the Foundation surpassed all prior amounts raised with a total of \$320,000, and now, because of your support, close to a million dollars is raised annually?

**Here are some highlights of how those much-needed funds are raised for Our House, Inc. through your generosity:**

Fundraising efforts for the fiscal year kicked off with a new way to participate in our third annual *Tee It Up for Our House Golf Outing* with the addition of our inaugural *Pickleball Charity Classic*. Throughout the day we were joined by 175 members of the Our House family for another amazing event that raised \$250,000!

◀ Golfers, picklers and lunch reception guests were greeted at check-in by some of our day program participants gifting them with handmade tie-dyed golf towels made with love by our residents.

◀ Our Hope Autism Solutions Day Program started in 2012 with the support of Hope Autism Foundation. Their legacy will continue through their final gift of \$222,000 to our Capital/Endowment Campaign.

The *Writing Rally* once again proved that the best gifts cannot be wrapped and must be felt with the heart! So many of our amazing staff and board members stopped by to write over 850 heartfelt notes to include with our year-end holiday cards in just two days to thank donors for making a difference. Along with the 11<sup>th</sup> Annual *Light the Way for Our House* Luminary Sale and #GivingTuesday, the campaign raised over \$154,000.

For the milestone 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of *Our House, Our Run* Sponsored By *The Martin Family*, a record-breaking \$212,000 was raised thanks to our 49 sponsors, 18 peer-to-peer fundraisers and their supporters plus 60 additional donors! We enjoyed a gorgeous spring day with 74 walkers and 276 runners, a majority of which competed in the USATF-NJ 700pt All Divisions Championship, at The Grove at The Park in Berkeley Heights. As always, our heartwarming part of the day was our *Everyone's A Winner Race* and their medal ceremony.

Did you know that the Foundation also secured over \$187,000 in grant funding from local and state corporate partners and foundations as well as over \$100,000 through restricted gifts, tributes and general donations? Some of those general donations come from third-party events and initiatives, such as a pop-up swag shop we held in the fall through **Givafifth**, our ongoing stores at **Crayola Flowers** and **See's Candies** and local efforts like the *Cases for a Cause Wine Tasting* held in June at the Summit Elks Club, which was spearheaded by two of our board members who are also members of the Elks and neighbors with Andy, a lifelong resident of Summit currently living in one of our apartments.

We are committed to offering our 300 residents, participants and supported employees meaningful experiences and paths that enable them to reach their utmost potential. Generosity from our families, donors, corporate partners, foundations and in-kind sponsors is instrumental for providing the adults we serve the opportunity to fulfill their aspirations and we thank all of our supporters for making a significant difference in their lives!

## HOUSING

Over the course of the past year, we completed construction at our recently acquired home in Watchung Borough and welcomed our six individuals with a ribbon cutting ceremony held in December. The residents moved from their supervised apartments that no longer suited their needs and are now safely aging in place while enjoying their freshly renovated home sweet home.

We are also excited to report that the ranch-style home in Bernards Township purchased last fiscal year was recently approved by the state for funding. Renovations are scheduled to begin in the fall and will include creating handicapped accessibility throughout the house and converting this into a four-bedroom home. The residence will serve a mix of our current residents who need an accessible home as well as new residents from our local community. We hope to move them in early next year.

Our Facilities Department continues to provide support to the agency's 19 group homes, five supported living apartments, four day program sites and two office buildings. Aside from routine and emergency maintenance duties on all of these properties, the department regularly inspects them to ensure they are safe, in good condition and compliant with applicable regulations.

From these recent inspections, we have identified a rise in the need for tree removal due to an increase in pests, disease and intense storms. Facilities has worked over the past year to prioritize these expenses and collaborated with the Foundation as they identified and secured sources of funding. For example, we completed a substantial kitchen and bathroom renovation at our residence in New Providence along with the purchase of new furniture and their tree removal thanks to local grants and restricted gifts.





Our House **serves 14 individuals** who are their **own guardians**? Being a self-guardian means that a person has the autonomy to make all decisions about their life and their care on their own.



The **average age** of the individuals we serve is now **38**, with our oldest being **82** and our youngest is **18**?



We were awarded a **nursing grant** from the **Healthcare Foundation of NJ** that is allowing Our House to expand our career pathing by attracting and advancing staff who want careers in healthcare?



We have an **Employee Engagement Committee** that plans events for our staff to boost morale and strengthen relationships as well as a **Career Path Committee** that encourages managers to identify employees who they feel could be a good fit for promotions and advancement?



**Every employee** of Our House, whether client-facing or administrative, is **CPR/First Aid certified**?



We empower our clients by holding open houses where they have the **opportunity to interview** the Direct Support Professionals who will be supporting them in their home and in their day programs? This allows our individuals to have control over who they work with on a daily basis and for them to begin **building a working relationship for success**.
